

## Concert Attire for Men

**Official Concert Attire** – to be worn at all concerts unless notified otherwise

### **TUXEDO**

Tuxedo is the official attire, however a black suit is acceptable. Must be plain and entirely black. No stripes, plaids, herringbone, tweed, or any other pattern. No velvet, velour, lace, metallic or satin trim. Satin lapels and a single satin stripe down the trouser leg are acceptable, however.

Coats to be buttoned during concert, including entry and exit.

### **SHIRTS**

A white tuxedo shirt is preferred if a tuxedo is worn, with a plain white shirt as an alternative. Pleats are acceptable. Ruffles are not acceptable.

### **ACCESSORIES**

Shirt Studs	Must be black or white. Standard white shirt buttons are also acceptable.
Bow Tie	Required. Must be plain and entirely black.
Cummerbund	Optional but if worn, plain and entirely black unless completely invisible to the audience when jacket is buttoned.
Shoes	Completely black. Patent leather is acceptable. No beads, non-black buckles or any other adornment.
Socks	Black opaque.
Jewelry	Ear jewelry is acceptable as stud-style or up to a 1/2" drop.
Hair Bands	Hair bands or ties are acceptable if not clearly visible from the front.

No other ornamentation, including hats or neck scarves, may be worn.

### **Alternate Black Shirt Concert Attire**

Under certain circumstances, including extreme heat, the Executive Director or the Artistic Director may call for an alternate concert attire as described below.

- A plain black collared shirt with long sleeves and black buttons.
- No tie or jacket.
- If a t-shirt is worn under the shirt, it must be black unless completely hidden.
- Black dress pants with a simple, small buckle black belt. Metallic buckles are acceptable.
- Tuxedo pants are also acceptable. Suspenders may be worn if they are black.

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
